CIGIE ANNUAL REPORT TO CONGRESS

The Council of the Inspectors General on Integrity and Efficiency (CIGIE) released its <u>Annual Report to the President and Congress</u>, offering a collective review of all OIG work conducted in fiscal year (FY) 2024 and underscoring the important role OIGs play in detecting fraud, waste and abuse across the Federal Government. Key takeaways are as follows:

- More than 14,000 employees across 73 OIGs conducted audits, inspections, evaluations, and investigations, resulting in significant improvements to the economy and efficiency of government programs.
- OIGs collectively identified approximately \$71.1 billion in monetary accomplishments.
- The OIG community's aggregate FY 2024 budget was approximately \$3.9 billion, meaning these potential savings represent roughly \$18 returned for every dollar invested in OIGs.
- OIGs' collective efforts resulted in 3,675 successful criminal prosecutions and 1,015 successful civil actions.

RED FLAG ALERT: TIME AND ATTENDANCE FRAUD

Preventing time and attendance fraud starts with understanding it: this type of fraud occurs when employees misreport hours worked. Look over the following statements — can you identify the red flags?

- My organization has a policy on when timesheets are due each week.
- If I forget to clock out, it's acceptable to ask a colleague to clock out for me.
- 3. My timesheet has codes to accurately reflect tasks completed during the workday.
- My timesheet entries look the same each week.
- 5. If I cannot remember how many hours I worked during the pay period, I estimate.
- 6. My supervisor, or their delegate, approves my leave prior to me taking it.

IMPORTANCE OF OIG HOTLINES

Did you know that hotline reports play a vital role in helping the OIG detect fraud, waste, and abuse? Over the last 3 years alone, hotline complaints have produced 56 investigations resulting in 25 administrative disciplinary actions (e.g., suspensions or removals), \$388,000 in restitution, and 2 civil/criminal convictions. Your voice matters — if you see something, report it!

Answer Key: If you answered 2, 4, and 5, congratulations! You correctly identified the red flags. Continue to stay watchful and help safeguard against time and attendance fraud.




